



### **ENGAGING WITH PARTNERS**

### FROOD EXPANSION

To centralize Compass's mental health services and to improve access for our clients, Compass expanded its footprint at the 62 Frood location. The new space at Frood features 11 therapy rooms, a large waiting room area, updated spaces for groups and new office spaces.





### ORGANIZATION RE-DESIGN

The Agency utilized a consultant to conduct an organizational review to provide recommendations for new internal structures to support people and business practices. Numerous engagement sessions were completed with staff and leadership to develop the recommendations which have been integrated throughout the organization.

Compass's Wellness Team continues to ensure staff have the opportunity to practice self-care and engage in safe and effective use of self. The Sanctuary Model (Trauma Informed Workplace) was introduced to the Leadership team and a work plan was developed to guide the Team's actions moving forward.

### TRAUMA INFORMED COMMUNITY

Compass received an Innovative Initiatives grant from the Centre of Excellence for Child and Youth Mental Health to build a trauma informed community.

To date, Compass has provided trauma informed training to over 88 community partners so they can better support the youth they serve who may have experienced trauma.

# COMPASS BY THE NUMBERS

### **CHILD & YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH (CYMH)**

In 2019/20 Compass provided **over 12,000 client sessions**. These sessions included:

- **✓** Over **4,000** counselling and therapy sessions
- Over **2,500 brief/mindSPACE sessions**
- Over **600 group sessions**

Compass provided diagnostic assessments and services to **131 clients** with or suspected to have an intellectual disability or a global developmental delay (GDD).

The Resource Program supported 15 child care centres and 26 children in the Sudbury and Manitoulin Districts. These children have a variety of needs and staff worked collaboratively with other service providers to ensure all children have the proper supports to attend child care centres.
